Follow-up: Payroll information for pay periods 22 and 23

This is a follow-up to our stand-up talk dated October 18.

As mentioned previously, the Postal Service identified a payroll processing error involving overtime during the September 29 to October 12 pay period, which was reflected in paychecks dated October 19.

This resulted in discrepancies in some employees' overtime pay. Those employees have been identified, and most are in APWU (American Postal Workers Union) bargaining positions. Regular-hour pay is not affected, and Postal Service management is continuing work to correct the issue as quickly as possible.

Adjustments were made so that missing overtime will be included on the November 2 pay (this Friday) for many employees. Those employees who do not see overtime reflected on their November 2 pay stubs will have adjustments processed and shown on their November 16 pay stubs. Thank you for your patience as work continues to correct the missing hours.

Any employee affected may still request a salary advance in accordance with USPS policies, which have been temporarily waived to allow a salary advance for overtime worked during pay period 21. If you wish to request a salary advance, contact your immediate supervisor.
